**CIVIL MATTERS**

All civil hearings and trials, both jury and nonjury, are cancelled through May 1, 2020. This includes domestic matters and chambers calendars (with the exception of the “fast-track” criminal non-jury calendars in Appling, Jeff Davis and Wayne Counties; see below). Regarding emergency civil matters, such as TPOs, TROs, etc., the clerk shall notify the judge listed below for each respective county of any petition for emergency relief received and shall forward a copy of said petition to that judge for handling:

- Appling County – Judge Kelley
- Camden County – Judge Harrison
- Glynn County – Judge Scarlett; Judge Kelley; Judge Lane
- Jeff Davis County – Judge Lane
- Wayne County - Judge Guy

## **CRIMINAL MATTERS**

All Appling County criminal jury trials set for the week of April 13, 2020 are cancelled.

All Glynn County criminal jury trials set for the week of April 13, 2020 are cancelled.

Appling County and Glynn County calendar call scheduled for March 30, 2020 is cancelled.

Appling County and Glynn County motions calendars scheduled for April 3, 2020 are cancelled.

Camden County criminal calendar call scheduled for April 20, 2020 is cancelled.

Camden County criminal motions scheduled for April 24, 2020 are cancelled.

Camden County misdemeanor criminal jury trials scheduled for April 27, 2020 are cancelled.

There will be no changes in any criminal non-jury ("fast-track") calendar currently scheduled. Those matters shall proceed as currently scheduled but shall be conducted via video conferencing.

With regard to arraignments, any currently scheduled arraignment for a defendant who is out on bond shall be continued; however, any future arraignment for a defendant who is incarcerated shall proceed as scheduled.
